Value-based Evaluate ethical issues and controversies	 engages students in conducting moral reasoning and making moral decisions realizes social diversity and be sensitivity to cultural similarities and differences be aware of social policy implications recognition of opposing points of view practice tolerance and compromise commitment to social responsibility and action
Challenging Use thought- stimulating inquiry assignments	 conduct research project uses varieties of sources of information with different perspectives makes well-reasoned and informed decisions well-reasoned arguments on controversial issues work productively with others (a learning community)
