- 1. Title
- 2. Criteria
- 3. Scale -- Performance levels (terms)
- 4. <u>Descriptor</u> -- Description of performance levels

Steps for Developing a Rubric

- Step 1: Identify the topic and criteria based on the critical attributes of the project
- **Step 2**: Decide levels of performance/achievement and choice of terms (3 5)
- Step 3: Write descriptions of performance/achievement for each level
- **Step 4:** Decide grade distribution on each criteria and each performance levels.
- **Step 5:** Explain the rubric clearly to learners (Rubric will serve as a study guide for students. It can tell how to do something during course of action and how well it is done after it is graded.)
