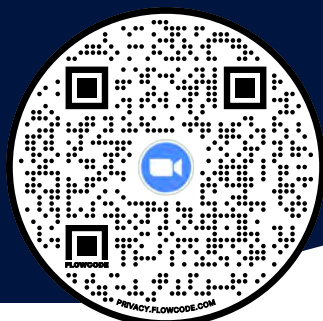
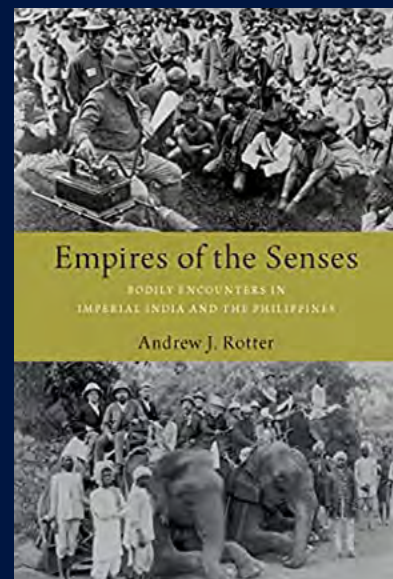
ODOR AND EMPIRE: GREAT BRITAIN IN INDIA, THE UNITED STATES IN THE PHILIPPINES



Dr. Andrew Rotter is the Charles A. Dana Professor of History, Emeritus, at Colgate University in Hamilton, New York. This talk draws on his book, *Empire of the Senses: Bodily Encounters in Imperial India and the Philippines* (Oxford, 2019). Rotter's research examines how "all human relationships, including imperial ones, are shaped by the five senses." His talk will discuss the field of "sensory history," and how we can more fully understand the imperial experience of the British

in India and the United States in the Philippines by considering how the agents of imperialism and the people they encountered perceived each other through the sense of smell.
