Topic:

Write an essay that compares and contrasts the viewpoints of Zhang Daye, author of the memoir *World of a Tiny Insect* completed in 1894, and Pa Chin [Ba Jin], author of the autobiographical novel *Family* published only thirty-seven years later in 1931. The comparisons should focus on the social and political problems that each author believed was the most pressing at the time of writing. Based on the comparisons, develop a thesis arguing for the key *historical* developments between the late-nineteenth and early twentieth centuries that can explain the similarities and/or differences in their opinions about social and political problems. The *historical thesis* should be based on evidence drawn from the memoir and novel—including the translators' introductions, class lectures and discussions, electronic reserves readings, and *The Search for Modern China*.

Additional research in library sources is allowed, but not necessary. NO INTERNET SITES ARE ALLOWED UNLESS LEHMAN LIBRARY PROVIDES DATABASE LINKS TO THEM. Cite all sources in proper Chicago A or B format. Non-history majors may use MLA.

Evaluation of Papers:

80% of the grade will be based on content. Grades of A will be awarded to papers that develop a clear thesis that is defended with persuasive evidence drawn from the memoir, novel, other assigned readings, discussions and lectures.

The other 20% will be based upon grammar and word usage (4%), spelling, capitalization and punctuation (4%), organization (4%), readability (4%), and citations and bibliography (4%).
