### **DISSERTATION**

“An Exploratory Study of Thanking: Native Norms vs. Non-Native Production.” The study investigates the acquisition of the speech act of thanking, both at the sociolinguistic and lexical levels and for two groups of non-native speakers of Spanish and French. Their production is compared to that of native speakers in the two languages.

I am Professor of Spanish and French since the spring of 2008. I started teaching at Shippensburg University in the fall of 1998 and I am the chair of the department since May of 2005.

#### **Undergraduate courses taught at Shippensburg University**

In French, I have taught beginning French I as well as French II and III, the intermediate grammar and literature course, introduction to reading, phonetics, composition and stylistics, the survey of French literature and the survey of literature from French – speaking countries, advanced grammar, commercial French, culture and civilization taught in English. I have developed a seminar on the History of the French Language, a seminar on the Literature of childhood, a seminar on French Literature in Film and a special culture topic course on wars. I taught the History of the French Language at the graduate level in the 2009 summer.

In the spring of 2007, I co-taught and International Education Seminar with Dr. Botteron, from the Political Science Department, and Dr. Joseph, from the History Department. The topic was Imperialism and the New Colonialism. The course was taught in English.

In Spanish, I have taught Spanish I, II, and III, the intermediate and advanced conversation courses, phonetics, advanced grammar, composition and stylistics, civilization and culture taught in English. I have developed two special culture topic courses in Spanish, one on wars, one on religions, as well as two seminars, one on Latin American literature, language and arts in the Twentieth Century, and another on the History of the Spanish language. I also have supervised several internships with the Franklin County Migrant worker Education and Head Start in Chambersburg, Pa. I taught the History of the Spanish Language at the graduate level in the 2009 summer.

In the summer of 2007, I co-taught a seminar course in Michoacán, Mexico with Dr. Paul Marr of the Geography Department. The topic was Geography and Culture of the Purépecha Region. The course was taught in English and Spanish.

In the spring 2009, I have co-taught in English a course in the Interdisciplinary Art Program with Dr. Ted Carlin. The course revolved on three topics: the myth of Icarus, the artist as the subject, and people and technology. I chose to illustrate the topics with cultural elements of the French and Spanish speaking countries, yet did not limit myself to them.

- I am presently conducting sociolinguistic research in the Latino community in the area. My project research involves human subjects and was approved by the Committee on Research on Human Subjects. A first component of the research was presented in January 2004 at the Hawaii International Conference on Arts and Humanities and was accepted for publication in the conference proceedings. A second component was presented at the 2006 MACLAS conference and a third one was presented at the American Society of Geolinguistics Conference, New York, NY, September 28-30, 2006.

The research is being done in conjunction with Dr. Paul Marr of the Geography Department and also has independent components.
